GENERAL EXPENSE FUND 667.1

Motion to approve the General expenditure scripts as presented in the Secretary's Financial Report made by Commissioner Virts, seconded by Commissioner Montag, (2 yay, 0 nay, 1 absent) motion passed.

Motion to approve capital expenditure scripts as presented in the Secretary's Financial Report made by Commissioner Virts, Seconded by Commissioner Connor (3 yay, 0 nay) motion passed.

Invested funds

Discussion on the investments and why Capital funds had not been reinvested to date. The consensus was to reinvest as much as possible as we draw down the funds.

CHIEF'S/TRAINING REPORT - see attached.

Additional information included damage to items on the engine that was at station 32. Chief request direction from the board on what to do with the damaged engine. The cab is crushed, and it is likely to be totaled. Insurance will offer a value on the vehicle. There may be options to buy it back and sell it for scrap or sell it to an alternative use.

CAPITAL PROJECTS Robert Merritt project manager – mHc Associates (see attached)

Station 31 Progress Report

Close to completion apart from electrical. Due to delays in supplies, the new 600-amp electrical panel is still waiting for parts to be manufactured (initial estimated date was Feb 1st, but that has changed to "unknown" status). The decision was made to temporarily connect the station to the existing 400-amp power panel until the new system is complete.

Office area and training room have finish trim going in.

Training room kitchenette still needs to be purchased by the district (must be ADA compliant). The estimate for the training room was \$22,000 and includes installation of the kitchenette.

Kitchen – waiting for gas ranges, fridge freezers and countertop/sink. These items need to be ADA compliant and purchased by the district.

Outside - bollards, water lines, radio tower base is installed,

Power and IT cables have been laid to the future site of external building.

Sign Off schedule- a walk through is planned for either Wednesday 16th or 23rd. A punch list of jobs to finish will be established, after which temporary occupancy y can be granted.

Rain Garden - Washington State Department of Ecology Mr. King visited both Station 31 and Station 32 on Tuesday February 8th and will provide a written evaluation.

CAPITAL PURCHASES – nothing to report currently.

4. Station 32 Collapse

Pole barn section of the station is the area that collapsed. The north wall has pulled away and is leaning out. The columns have been displaced by up to 2 inches at the base and lean out considerably.

Plan is to remove the columns and pour foundations for new walls to support the structure Estimate- \$375,202.19 to rebuild Station 32. ("not to exceed" terminology used in estimates to restrain costs). That does not include engineer and architect (approx. \$22,000), nor the roof (approx. \$90,000).

Timeline: The plan and estimates need to pass through the insurance company before we can move forward. Dana Hale estimated it will take until April before it is complete.

Contract Amendments:

Waiting on the Attorney Brian Snure to complete the addendums to the construction contracts. The district needs to address the liquidated damages section of the contract. The district

understands the delays are out of the control of the contractor. Having a final date for Station 31 should be reasonable to estimate. A final date for station 32 will be more difficult to determine as we do not know how long the insurance company will take to approve the rebuilding plans.

- 5. **Surplus** Camas Valley FD is interested in purchasing the remaining Plymo-vent system. Waiting for details if it will fit their station.
- 6. Out of District Billing no update.
- 7. Ambulance A31 can be removed from agenda.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Station 31 HVAC

The Heating and Air system for the training room and hallway has failed. Repair and replacement costs were sent out to the board. Chief has spending authority to make the purchase but wanted direction from the board. Consensus was to replace with a new propane unit rather than repair an old one.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION – Commissioner Montag opened the floor for public discussion at a maximum of 5 minutes per participant.

Sheri Bousquet comments/concerns:

- Department of Ecology visit to station 31 would like information on the visit from Department
 of ecology. Why were they visiting, what was the outcome and what will the depart be doing
 about the outcome?
- Plumbing to the rain garden- she has concerns about what will be put down the drains. Will an
 oil water separator be installed?
- Generator
 - would like Mr. Merritt to explain again why the decision was made to move the industrial propane generator from the alcove in the middle of the site to 5ft from the property line.
 - o Expressed concerns with
 - noise level
 - The generator does not have a sound wall.
 - It is placed less than 50ft from a residential home,
 - It will be started every month
 - Air quality from the generator when in use
 - o Who in the county approved the relocation of the generator?

District responses:

The Department of Ecology- DOE received a complaint about the rain garden and contacted the
district for information. During the dialogue with DOE Chief invited them to visit both Station 31,
and Station 32 to review the rain gardens. DOE visited both sites and was shown how the

systems were designed/permitted by professionals, and functioning including what areas of the site were draining into the rain garden. Waiting for a written response from DOE if any changes are required to the system.

- Plumbing- see DOE visit above.
- Generator Mr. Merritt responded: In the original design the generator was in the alcove at Station 31. Mr. Merritt noticed that it was close to the HVAC system and could cause a problem with carbon monoxide being pulled into air intake and into the building (he has prior experience with this situation). He advised the architect to move the generator, he did not specify where to move it to, other than "somewhere other than next to the HVAC". The architect moved it to the SE corner. The new location is cost effective as it is a shorter run for wiring to and from the electrical panels in the mechanical room. Any more details on the location would need to be directed to Architect and engineers.
 - The district hired professionals to design and install the equipment. All the plans were submitted to the county which they permitted. The project manager and the board rely on the professionals and the county building officials to review and permit the process.

Good of the Order: The Citizens Advisory Committee were commended for their outstanding contributions to the district since 2013. They have been instrumental in providing long range goals, direction, and expectations of the fire department. It was noted that the original 12-member group has shrunk as people have moved away. It was suggested that the group reach out for new members to help guide the district into the future.

Regular Board Meeting will be THURSDAY March 10th at 3pm (1500 hrs.).

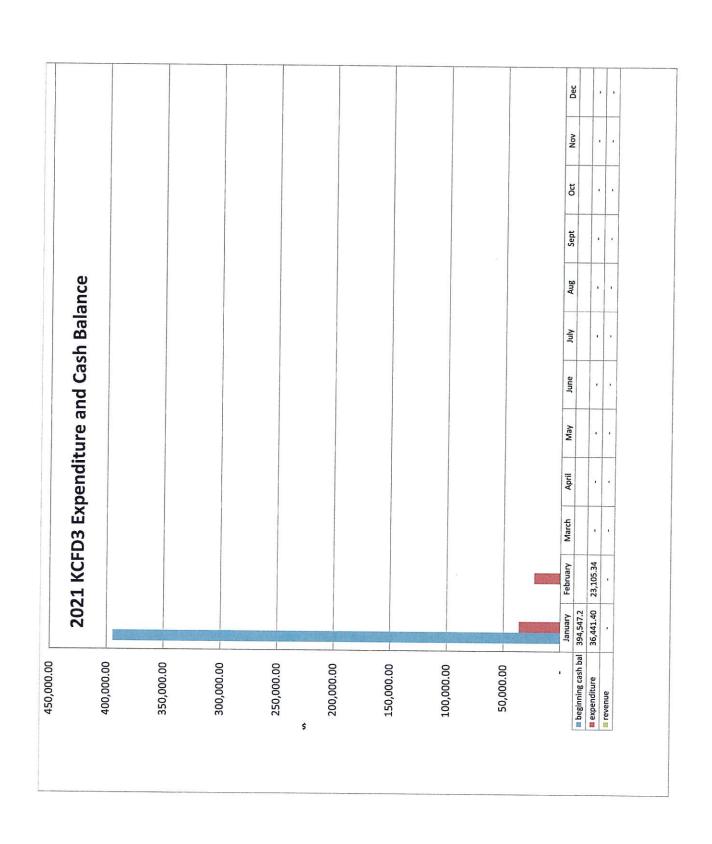

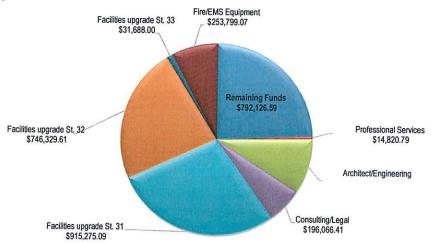

Fire Chief's Report to Board of Commissioners February 9, 2022

Safety Near Miss: One near miss occurred while KCFD3 was on scene of a 2-car MVC at SR 141 and Fruit Home Colony Road. Traffic control measures were in place. Using TIM'S (Traffic Incident Management System) units placed flares at NW Lake Road and 141 to give 'pre-alert' notification to southbound traffic of an incident. While performing traffic control a semi-truck traveling southbound had difficulty stopping in the black ice - nearly colliding with Engine 31. Alert personnel conducting traffic control, were able to safely get to the side of the road.

6-Minutes for Safety planned 2/8/2022: Roadway operations and TIMS reminders. Structure Fire hazards and BLEVE's (LODD St. Paul Oregon fire department 2/5/22 due to explosion while working 'defensive mode' on a barn fire.

Customer Service (emergent and non-emergent):

- 8 calls within KCFD3's service area since your January meeting.
 - Eryie Road fire required significant time to investigate and meet with insurance adjusters at the site two days after the event. (Electrical fire which damaged some structure components).

Projects:

Bond:

- Camas Valley Fire Department continues to express interest to purchase Plymovent System that was removed from Station 32. Working with Bob Merritt to accomplish that task. (02/07/22: they are evaluating the cost and application to their facility)
- 2. SCBA compressor, cascade bottles and hoses arriving early March.
- 3. Requested input from members for cabinetry in kitchen and training room. Ordered cabinetry for kitchen/training room. Cancelled the order due to adjustments needed for ADA requirements. Roz has been working with Jeff Dellis to get needed information before re-order is completed.
- 4. Moving SCBA fill station down to the station as soon as approved by contractor.
- 5. Relocating Station 32 antenna tower down to Station 31 to get it on to district property until installation.

Apparatus/Fleet:

- 1. Met with insurance appraiser to go over Engine 331. Provided them with electronic photos and equipment lists. Waiting for final determination in writing but it appears it will be categorized as a complete loss.
- 2. Engine 31 remains in the fire station. Aid 31, Brush 31 remain at Ryan Krepps' shop.
- 3. Water Tender 31 is currently in the body shop as planned for repairs. Expected to be out for 2 weeks. (Update 2/7/22 - Body repairs nearly completed. It will go into the paint booth next. Vendor suggesting possibly 2 more weeks).
- 4. Zach Langren working on a fuel issue with Engine 31 positive pressure fan. Runnability issues from being in the cold environment. Cycling new fuel through the system.
- SCBA Batteries changed in fleet.
- SCBA bench testing scheduled for March 10th at White Salmon.
- 7. Citizen smoke complaints. Followed up on citizen smoke complaint. Found unauthorized slash burning on Shadow Lane. Met with DNR at the site to provide information. Email dialog with WDOE, Mayor Keethler and reporting citizen.

KCIFA.

Chiefs met on 1/26. Provided comprehensive report to KCIFA about the Fire Defense Committee Regional Update, upcoming NFIRS reporting training, and upcoming DNR fire prevention opportunities.

Type 3 Team Assignment: Annual sign up in process. Supervisor approval due February 11th.

Personnel:

- 1. Promoted Firefighter Jeremy Gross to the rank of Captain.
- 2. Obtained two new members: Elizabeth Payne and Casey Wykes.
- 3. Two members currently on leave for personal needs.
- 4. Officer's meeting held in person 1/25/2022. (Riggleman, Helton, Grose, Long)
- Annual Fit Testing: Starting 2/8/22 for firefighters and EMT's (N-95 masks).

Community Building/pre-planning:

- Planning communications to the school Superintendent with the goal of getting KCFD3 back into
 the schools to help with CPR training, fire inspection surveys and ongoing emergency planning.
 Covid restrictions have put these activities on hold.
- Awards Banquet: Tentative date: April 2, 2022, 1700 hours
- Incident Reporting: Fire District 3 fully compliant with NFIRS reporting to the State. Only 4 of the 18 fire departments in Klickitat County are submitting as required.
- Annexation petitions: Property owner near Bingen has not submitted documents needed. No other annexation requests currently.
- COVID-19: All Fire District 3 personnel compliant with Covid documentation as accommodations
 have been allowed. No documented exposures due to service provided or from assemblies. Currently,
 training is being adjusted to minimize congregating in groups to help prevent exposures. All personnel
 continue to wear PPE as required.
- DNR Fuels Grant: Informed by DNR to be prepared to begin citizen notifications for Phase 2 of this
 grant. Phase 1 has not gained momentum up to this point. **Fuels reduction: Indian Hills Drive across
 Snowden Road westerly toward SR 141 = Phase 2.
- "Culture Class" 2/15/22 attending a one-day class surrounding fire department culture and how to
 implement "One Mission / Many Individuals" to set the table for growth and change. Free class: Clark
 County Fire District 3 this class is not open to others. Invited to observe content delivery.

Training Report:

- Firefighter attack drill at Bingen training grounds. (Victim rescue drill)
- Multi-company pump training. E31, E9 and WT 7.
- Apparatus Inspections (no business meeting for January)
- First Aid/CPR in the que when Covid concerns subside again.
